SCRIPT NOTE: Asterisks besides a cue number (for example: 3*) indicate that the performer of that cue wait for music or a sound effect to establish itself and in some cases, await a signal from the director to begin. It is recommended that the master script be marked with a handlettered "Q" to the left of these special cues, so they stand out better.

ABOUT THAT ARK... 1.

1. MUSIC: [A-1] MAIN THEME--UP. FADE UNDER.

2* HOST:

As you may know, many animal welfare groups conduct pet adoptions—mass adoptions at local parks—where homeless animals find a new life and new companions. (PAUSE) Part of the process involves "home checks"—to weed out laboratories, vaudeville acts, and other "unsuitable" homes. (PAUSE) But these inspections stretch way back. Here's one of the first home checks—dating from...

Biblical times...

3. SOUND: HAMMERING. SAWING. INSPECTOR POUNDS ON

DOOR (4X) - REPEATEDLY UNDER.

4* INSPECTOR: (CALLING OUT) Hello? Hello! This is the home checker from the pet orphanage. I know you're in there. Open up! Surprise home check!

5. SOUND: HAMMERING, SAWING STOPS. DOOR OPENS.

- 6* CAP'N: (SHEEPISHLY) Uh, Yes? What can I do for you?
- 7. INSPECTOR: I'm from the pet orphanage. I'm here to inspect your.... what is this? A houseboat?
- 8. CAP'N: Houseboat? It's three hundred cubits... by

 fifty cubits... by thirty cubits! It's a

 cruise ship! (PAUSE) What you call... an ark!

1. THE MISSUS: Yeah! A cruise ship in the middle of a

parched desert! No wonder we're being

inspected!

(several scenes later...)

8. INSPECTOR: I see. Now, you're requesting to adopt some

more animals. Um... why?

9. CAP'N: Well... for the uh... rainy season...

10. SOUND: THUNDER (2X)

ABOUT THAT ARK... 4.

1* CAP'N: (LISTENS-PAUSE) ...which may start any minute

now--my wife and I are going on a little...

cruise. And we want to take some pets along.

2. INSPECTOR: OK, how many?

3. CAP'N: (HOPEFUL) A few... of everything.

4. THE MISSUS: (SHOCKED) What?!

5. CAP'N: Actually, I was thinking uh... nine... of

everything.

6. INSPECTOR: Nine? ... of everything? Impossible!

7 SOUND: THUNDER (2X)

ABOUT THAT ARK... 5.

5. THE MISSUS: Uh-oh! Better hold onto something, Inspector.

Here they come!

6. SOUND: WALLA: ANIMALS. STAMPEDE. HOOVES. CRASHING.

7* CAP'N: Yes! My pets, Inspector... It's a stampede!

8. INSPECTOR: A stampede?

9. THE MISSUS: Yeah. The two p.m. stampede.

10. CAP'N: Um... My pets just love... shuffleboard,

y'know. (NERVOUS LAUGH) Heh-heh...

11. SOUND: STAMPEDE BUILDS--SUDDENLY STOPS ON A DIME.

(PAUSE) DOOR KNOCK (4X)

ABOUT THAT ARK... 6.

1* CAP'N: (DELICATELY) Um. It's them. Don't get up.

I'll be right back, Inspector.

2. SOUND: CAP'N FOOTSTEPS.

3* THE MISSUS: (CALLING AFTER HIM) Tell them no stampeding

in the kitchen! I just waxed those floors!

4. CAP'N: (DISTANT) I know, Joan! I'll tell them again.

5. SOUND: DOOR OPENS/WALK THRU/CLOSES.

SUDDEN SFX: SQUEAKS. DONKEY.

WALLA: ANGRY OINKS, MOOS, SQUAWKS.

6* CAP'N: (BELEAGURED) All right! All right. What is it

now?

ABOUT THAT ARK... 7.

2* SHIP'S ANNOUNCER: [FILTER/ECHO] Attention! Attention. Thou

3. SOUND: "MOOOOOOO" WALLA: COMPLAINING OINKS, MOOS,

SQUAWKS. STOP UNDER.

SCRIPT HAS BEEN TRUNCATED AT THIS POINT

(several scenes later...)

7. INSPECTOR: No! That's it! I've seen enough! I'm sorry,

but there's no way I can approve this mass

adoption. I can't allow any more pets into

this "home."

8. CAP'N: But Inspector... why?

9. INSPECTOR: First, it's unsafe! There are tools

everywhere. It's overcrowded. Unsanitary. A

houseboat is not a suitable home for pets.

ABOUT THAT ARK... 8.

8. CAP'N: Inspector? Did...did you say "titanic?"

9. INSPECTOR: Yes. Why?

10. CAP'N: I like the ring of that... "Titanic!"

11. THE MISSUS: It sounds kinda grandy-ose! I like it.

12. CAP'N: Yes! I hereby christen this ark, "Titanic."

13. SOUND: THUNDER (3X)

14* MUSIC: [A-3] RIP CHORD-CLOSER--UNDER. LET IT FADE UNDER.

15* HOST: Tune in again, next week, for another episode

of "About That Ark..."

Radio Skills School

Microphone Technique:

- 1) Sensitive and dead areas. Don't touch!
- 2) Proximity effect. (Boomy if too close.)
- 3) Proper distance for radio acting.
- 4) Dynamics and distance. (Back off to yell.)
- 5) Off mic use for distant sounds. Asides.
- 6) Popping "P"s and S-S-S-Sibilance.
- 7) Mic safety. (hitting, blowing, dropping)
- 8) Assume every mic is always ON.
- 9) Quiet script page turning.

Radio Acting:

- 1) Quiet in the studio.
- 2) Don't cough, laugh, or talk during production.
- 3) Watch the director. Wait for your cue. (Q)
- 4) Speed equals excitement. Don't bore audience.
- 5) Jump in if there's dead air.
- 6) Wait for director's signal at end of show.

Radio Direction "Sign Language"

- 1) "Wait." Open hand.
- 2) "5-4-3---" Finger count down.
- 3) "You're on." Pointing finger.
- 4) "Wrap it up." Finger draws circles.
- 5) "Stretch it out." Pulling taffy.
- 6) "Louder." Pull ear.
- 7) "Quieter." Finger to lip (Shhhh-style)
- 8) "Cut." Finger slits throat.
- 9) "Come in" or "Back off" microphone.

CASTING MONOLOGUES:

All actors are asked to read some lines, called "sides," aloud to audition. The director will cast the roles in our production based upon these readings. Please take a moment to read the lines below several times, both silently and aloud. These monologues also provide some "back story," giving an idea of who the characters are and what kind of story we are producing. Since radio actors often play several parts, we encourage the use of different voices or accents for the different roles.

HOST:

I host "About That Ark..." and setup the drama, explaining how animal welfare groups conduct mass-adoptions of homeless pets. They do "home checks" to evaluate the "suitability" of the homes adopted animals may wind up in. Optionally, I may also act as the ship's public address announcer,

INSPECTOR:

(IMPERIOUSLY) I'm a "home checker," seeking to weed out the liars and <u>nutsos</u> who might try to adopt pets and then not take good care of them. I don't trust people who live on houseboats, <u>especially</u> in Biblical times.

This particular applicant seems "fishy."

THE MISSUS:

I'm the long suffering wife of an eccentric animal lover and wanna-be sailor. My husband's been hearing voices and acting strange. I'm not happy with all these pets he's got. And now he wants... more? We'll see about that!

SOUND EFFECT ROLES:

SOUND EFFECT ARTIST #1:

HAMMERING

DOOR KNOCKS, OPENS, CLOSES:

STAMPEDE

FOOTSTEPS ON DECK

DONKEY

BOING STICK

WIND

SOUND EFFECT ARTIST #2:

SAWING

TRUNK TRUMPET

THUNDER

HOOVES

CRASHING

SQUEAKS

RABBIT GARGLES

RAIN (if no pre-recorded effect is available)

HAMMERING:

Several hammers taping on wood or SFX table.

DOOR KNOCKS, OPENS, CLOSES:

STAMPEDE:

Put 7 potatoes in a pillowcase and "flump" it about on a table.

FOOTSTEPS ON DECK:

Walk on a raised wooden platform: Two 2x4 "rails" and 18×24 piece of 3/4" playwood.

DONKEY:

Twist glass scratch SFX device to "he-haw" OR use mouth sounds.

BOING STICK:

Pluck banjo string on bowed plywood "neck" attached to cigar box.

WIND:

Crank mechanical wind machine OR use mouth sounds

SAWING:

Actual saw or a threaded plumbing tube pulled across a box edge.

TRUNK TRUMPET:

Buzz, elephant-like, through a long plastic "football fan" horn.

THUNDER:

Shake thunder tube (Bongo with 36" spring attached to head) OR shake a sheet of 1/16" high-impact polystyrene (size: $2' \times 4'$)

HOOVES:

Clip clop coconuts in a small gravel box, on a big drum.

CRASHING:

Shake crash box SFX device.

SQUEAKS:

Squeeze many little rubber duckies to sound like mice/rats.

RABBIT GARGLES:

Shake a small toy "ugly stick" rapidly OR use flick fingers over lips while making high pitched mouth sounds.

DOG RARFS:

Say "rarf" while inhaling.

RAIN:

Use pre-recorded sample of rain OR turn a mechanical rainstick.

ENGINEER'S NOTES: "About That Ark..."

EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENT:

This show requires the use of a filter for ship's P.A. announcer voice effects. Please set up a microphone using a filter device for use by the announcer. An echo device should be on the same line. The intention is to mimic the sound of many speakers throughout the ark.

MUSIC CUES:

A complete engineer's script will be provided with highlights to show how long music cues or canned SFX run (through scenes and dialogue) and which characters are using reverb or filter and when. The final cues of rain SFX and the ripchord/closer music will overlap—having two CD players would be good, but one will do—just fade out the rain, advance to the next cue, fade back up quickly and trigger the cue. If you have two CD players, just alternate between with odd—numbered tracks on CD player #1 and even—numbered tracks on CD player #2.

- 1) Main Theme [BED] (0:20)
- 2) Rain SFX (1:00)
- 3) Ripchord/CLoser [BED] (0:30)
